- [Barnardos Haven Project](#) offers one-to-one sessions for unaccompanied children, family sessions, school-based programmes, and support group
Who is it for: children up to age 18 residents of North Lincolnshire
- [CAMHS](#) is an NHS service that provides therapy and emotional support for people with mental health challenges. You can find one in every local authority
Who is it for: children and young people, including unaccompanied children.
- [‘HEARTS’](#) project by Children’s Society which provides advocacy support and therapeutic support
Who is it for: young people aged 15-25 in Leeds.
- [Chilypep’s Children’s Wellbeing Practitioners \(CWP\)](#) offers several therapeutic and wellbeing services for young people based in South Yorkshire.
Who is it for: children and young people in Sheffield and Barnsley area.
- [Multi- agency Psychological Support for Looked After Children – MAPS](#) is a team of professionals who support the mental health.
Who is it for: children and young people looked after by Sheffield City Council.
- [Refugee Council ‘My View’ and ‘My View Remote’](#) also offers therapeutic support which includes up to 12 sessions and has capacity for up to three urgent interventions for those with more complex cases.
Who is it for: children between 12 and 17 years who are in Yorkshire and Humber and remotely.
- [Refugee Council ‘Children and Families Wellbeing Support’](#) provides free specialist child and family therapy service for children, families, and schools.
Who is it for: the Vulnerable Persons and Children’s Resettlement Schemes; the Gateway Protection Programme; the UK Resettlement Scheme and Afghan Resettlement Scheme and are in South Yorkshire.
- [Solace UK](#) provides therapeutic support at Bevan Healthcare for young people between 15 to 18 years old.
