Specific migrant groups

A new [Home Office factsheet on asylum accommodation sites](#) is available outlining new funding for local authorities, and states [a draft statutory instrument has been laid](#) as part of plans to remove HMO (House of Multiple Occupation) licensing rules from applying to asylum accommodation. The Home Office announced the [use of a barge as asylum accommodation](#) in Dorset for up to 500 single males seeking asylum. [The idea hasn't gone down well with locals](#) and there's suggestions it [could face legal action](#). (Sources: Home Office, the Guardian, BBC News)

A [new report reveals the negative impacts on people seeking asylum housed at Napier Barracks](#) and calls for the Home Office to permanently close the site. (Source: Jesuit Refugee Service)

[The National Age Assessment Board \(NAAB\) has launched](#), and is beginning a phased rollout, while [government confirms the use of scientific methods](#) as part of reforming age assessments.
